“SUNDAY MOORINGS”

Sunday “Moorings” increase our ties to each other and make us stronger as the body of Christ (the church). Concerning worship, we will continue to alternate our current styles of worship at 10 a.m. each Sunday. All Sundays are “Time after Pentecost.”

As a reminder for families with children under ten years old, Bible stories drawn from our Sunday lectionary readings, songs and handicrafts are at the center of age appropriate education each Sunday. With the leadership of Lynn Maragliano, an accomplished and seasoned Cleveland Hts. school teacher, weekly packets for teachers (two adults at a time, parents primarily) are available at the library in the Fellowship Hall to host a twenty-minute session. The session takes place during the “Word” section of the morning liturgy. Children gather at the chancel stairs before the Prayer of the Day, join in the prayer, and then are released to the teachers. Children return to worship for the “Meal” section of the liturgy.

Lynn is coordinating and scheduling the teachers. Several parents are taking turns. More parents and interested adults wanting to be part of the rotation should contact Lynn. Each teacher in the rotation leads the activities about once every six to eight weeks.

On Sundays when “big” stuff is happening there will be no education breakout class so to encourage the children to be part of the worship experience.

For parents with youth eleven years through eighteen years old, please consider encouraging your children to be part of an emerging way to support preteens and teenagers. Please contact Pastor David Ernat. Parents with questions about Baptism, Holy Communion, and / or Confirmation/Affirmation of Baptism are also encouraged to contact David.

A big part of our “Sunday Moorings” is fellowship. We have coffee every Sunday, and on some SUNDAYS, we do a whole lot more. On Sunday morning, September 13, as part of our congregational meeting to review and approve next year’s ministry expectations and budget we will also have “hot dogs.” On Sunday morning, October 25, REFORMATION SUNDAY, we will have our annual PORK and SAUERKRAUT FEAST.

Additional non-Sunday meal related fellowship activities are found in the HIGHLIGHTED “IDENTITY MINISTRY ACTIVITY” section of this newsletter.

IDENTITY TEAM UPDATE

At its spring meeting the Identity Team discussed the practice of placing a donation basket on the table at coffee hours. It was the consensus of the group that funds for fellowship hour should be part of the regular budget. Therefore, the following decision was made:

- Regular Sunday fellowship time – there will be no donation basket
- Hot Dog Sunday – a basket will be available. Donations collected will be designated for our building.
- Special Congregational Meals – a basket will be available. Donations collected will be designated to help defray the cost of our monthly community meals.
- Pot Luck meals – we each already donate food, therefore no basket.

It was further requested that people who host coffee hours and donate food items present the receipt to the church office so an accurate accounting can be had of the cost of the fellowship. Donors will be given a letter indicating the amount of in-kind donation.

It is our desire that guests should not feel obliged to contribute when joining fellowship activities on Sunday. The fellowship time is an identity ministry cost toward deepening our relationship with God and one another.

- Sept. 26: TV host Phil Cousineau will be at Trinity Cathedral downtown on Saturday morning, September 26. For \$15, you will be treated to a breakfast at 8:30, followed by Mr. Cousineau's talks on "The Art of Pilgrimage." To see what a treat this will be, visit his website, philcousineau.net.
- Oct. 3: Dr. Adrian Thatcher is coming from the University of Exeter in England on Saturday, October 3 to lead a 9 to 3 symposium at St. Paul's Episcopal Church on Fairmount Blvd. Sociologist Dr. Gary Polster from Ursuline College, will introduce him by commenting on a statistical study of the state of marriage. LOW-INCOME SENIOR HOUSING AND GRACE BUILDING UPDATE

At the September 13th congregational meeting, the Grace/housing work group will make good its commitment to present to the congregation a recommendation about the vision for the Grace building as a whole. The vision looks like this:

- A “state-of-the-art” updated and historic building providing:
- A) group worship/fellowship/educational space for the people of Grace, and;
 - B) for the people of Grace, the “heights” and the people of greater Cleveland
 - 1) music / public presentation space and reception facilities
 - 2) wedding ceremony and reception facilities
 - 3) senior housing (rental) space and support facilities.

The detailed business plans, (income/expenses/ownership and more), and the drawings to support this vision will emerge throughout the fall.

The vision for the building extends from Grace’s Vision and Mission Statements as the people of God in our place for ministry – the “heights” of Greater Cleveland:

(Vision) Making Christ Relevant to All

(Mission) The people of Grace Lutheran seek to model the love and compassion of Jesus Christ; embrace and value the diversity of God’s people; and, gather to engage in spiritual growth, social justice, service and celebration.

STRATEGIC EXPECTATIONS, BUDGET AND PLEDGES FOR 2010

Also at the September 13, congregational meeting, the congregation will be asked to vote on our 2010 Strategic Expectations and the budget to support it. The expectations and budget can be picked up for review starting September 1.

Your financial support for the 2010 Strategic Expectation and budget (a.k.a. the pledge/stewardship drive)

On Reformation Day, October 25, your Administrative Leadership and Grace Officers announce the beginning of the 2010 pledge drive. The drive will end with the offering / commitment of the pledges during our Christ the King worship, Sunday November 22.

The drive remains relatively low-key as the last few years. In 2010 we will enter the third and final challenge year of increasing our pledge amounts and increasing the number of households who pledge in our effort to have a balanced budget.

This year the administrative team is encouraging every pledge household that does or is able to manage their finances “on-line” to set up with its financial institution direct and regular monthly giving. Thrivent offers such a giving system if you choose not to use your bank or savings and loan. What this does is saves you money, the cost of postage, and helps the administrative team with cash flow. We suggest you use your bank because we believe your “bank” charges neither you nor Grace a fee. If you use Thrivent, there is a small fee incurred by Grace. But, it is worth it! Please check with Gayle or Sid in the office if you have questions about how this might work.

GRACE LUTHERAN CHURCH CONSTITUTION

The Administrative Team has previously reported to the Congregation that a Constitution Committee has been meeting to draft amendments and Bylaws to our Constitution to reflect the manner in which we as a Congregation have decided, and are in fact, carrying out our governance and management functions.

In anticipation that we will begin the new Liturgical year in December, 2009, under the Revised Amendments and Bylaws, the Administrative Team has scheduled the following Sundays, after the Worship Service, to present, explain, discuss and vote on the revisions to Chapters 10-14 of our Constitution.

1. October 4, 2009: A copy of Chapters 10-14, the proposed Amendments and Bylaws to our Constitution, will be distributed to the Congregation for review. Chapters 10-14 set forth a constitutional framework under which we will carry out our governance and management functions.
2. On October 4th, the Nominating Committee, which was duly elected under our existing Constitution will also present a slate of candidates for election to the positions of President, vice President, Secretary and Treasurer as well as candidates for election to the Nominating Committee under the Constitution as amended beginning December 1, 2009.
3. October 11 and October 18, 2009: The Constitution Committee will present a forum/explanation/discussion on the proposed Amendments and Bylaws.
4. November 15, 2009: The vote of the Congregation will be held to approve and adopt the proposed Amendments and Bylaws.
5. The Amendments and Bylaws, as approved by the Congregation, will be forwarded to the Synod Council of the ELCA for Synod approval at its meeting on January 23, 2010.
6. As required by the Model Constitution for ELCA Congregations, the Congregation will vote on May 15, 2010, to ratify the Amendments and Bylaws to our Constitution.
